Bible Story 16: SAMUEL HEARING GOD CALLING

SCRIPTURE: 1 Samuel 1:28; 2:11,18-21; 3:1-10,19-21

MEMORY VERSE: 1 Samuel 3:10

BIBLE STORY:

A mother called Hannah dedicated her son Samuel to God. She took her young child to Shiloh, where he lived and helped the priest Eli at the Tabernacle. Eli was the religious leader of Israel. He was getting old and he was almost blind.

One night the boy Samuel was sleeping in the tabernacle. (He probably was helping Eli by making sure the candles remained lighted all night in the tabernacle, as was required.) During the night, Samuel heard a voice calling his name:

VOICE (GOD): "Samuel, Samuel!"

NARRATOR: Samuel quickly went to Eli and said.

SAMUEL: "Sir, did you call me? Here I am."

ELI: "No, I didn't call you. Go back to bed."

NARRATOR: Samuel returned to his bed. For the second time the Lord called out:

VOICE (GOD): "Samuel, Samuel!"

NARRATOR: Once again Samuel got up and went to Eli, saying:

SAMUEL: "Sir, did you call me? Here I am again."

ELI: "Son, I did not call you. Return to your bed."

NARRATOR: Now for the third time the Lord called out:

VOICE (GOD): "Samuel, Samuel!"

NARRATOR: Once again Samuel got up and went to Eli, saying:

SAMUEL: "Sir, did you call me? Here I am."

NARRATOR: Finally Eli understood that it was God calling Samuel. Eli said,

ELI: "Samuel, it is the voice of God calling you. Return to your bed and, when the voice calls again, say, 'Speak, o God, for your servant listens.'"

NARRATOR: Samuel returned to his bed. For the fourth time, God called out:

VOICE (GOD): "Samuel, Samuel!"

NARRATOR: This time Samuel stayed in his bed and said.

SAMUEL: "Speak, God, for your servant listens."

NARRATOR: God had special plans for Samuel's life. He became a priest and prophet of God, respected by all the people in Israel.
